### **Two Arrested on Warrants After Stolen Vehicle Tracked to Home in the City**

**Pueblo, CO:** Pueblo County Sheriff's deputies arrested two people after tracking down a vehicle stolen from a Pueblo West home late Sunday night.

Deputies responded to the 500 block of Ferncliff Drive at about 11:30 p.m. Sunday on a report of a stolen truck. The owner reported his 2020 Toyota Tacoma was taken from his residence and he had three firearms in the vehicle.

Deputies, utilizing GPS technology, were able to track the truck to a residence in the 2500 block of Pine Street in the City of Pueblo. Deputies went to the Pine Street address and found the truck parked behind a home with a canopy over it. Deputies checking the truck found a woman sitting inside the truck. The woman said she was waiting for others inside the home to give her a ride to another location.

Deputies searched the truck but did not find any of the missing firearms. Deputies then went to the home to contact the occupants, but no one answered the door. Deputies then sought a search warrant for the home.

This morning, deputies executed the search warrant and recovered one of the guns that had been in the truck. They also recovered a second gun that was reported stolen out of the city. Deputies contacted four people inside the home and two were found to have outstanding warrants. Deputies arrested Dameron Carbajal, 31, on a no-bond fugitive of justice award and Zoei Coleman, 19, on a failure to appear warrant. Carbajal and Coleman have been booked into the Pueblo County Jail.

“The deputies did exceptional work utilizing technology to track down the vehicle and then use old-fashioned investigative police work to follow through with seeking and executing the search warrant, which ultimately led to the recovery of two stolen firearms,” said Pueblo County Sheriff David J. Lucero.

Lucero said the investigation is ongoing and additional charges and arrests could be forthcoming pending the outcome of the investigation.
