### Deputies Arrest Three Individuals Found in Parked Vehicles at Local Businesses

**Pueblo, CO:** Pueblo County Sheriff's deputies arrested three individuals in two separate, unrelated incidents early this morning after finding them asleep inside parked vehicles at local businesses. Two of the individuals were wanted on outstanding felony warrants from other jurisdictions.

At 1:30 a.m., deputies conducting routine patrols and business checks in Pueblo West located a 2016 Audi parked in the Walmart parking lot. Deputies found that the vehicle was registered to Kyle Dailey, 32, who was wanted in Wisconsin on two felony warrants. Deputies saw a man matching the description of Dailey asleep in the driver's seat. Deputies used their vehicles to block the front and back of Dailey's car to prevent him from driving off.

Deputies approached the car and made verbal commands for Dailey to get out of the car. Dailey refused orders. Deputies were eventually able to get him out of the vehicle at Taser point and take him into custody. Dailey was booked into the Pueblo County Jail on the outstanding warrant.

Approximately two hours later, in eastern Pueblo County, a deputy conducting routine patrols saw a 2012 Honda Civic parked at the Loaf N Jug, 31918 E. Highway 96. The deputy parked in front of the vehicle and saw a man and a woman asleep in the car. The deputy approached the vehicle and saw drug paraphernalia in plain view inside the car. The deputy knocked on the window, waking the occupants, identified as Dillion O'Neill, 31, of Lamar and Marissa Catanese, 27, of Canon City. O'Neill told deputies they had stopped to sleep after driving all day from Utah.

Deputies asked O'Neill and Catanese to get out of the car and when doing so, additional drug paraphernalia fell from O'Neill's lap. O'Neill admitted to having drugs in the vehicle. Deputies searched the car and found 2.66 grams of Fentanyl and 43.67 grams of methamphetamine. Deputies also located another 1.43 grams of Fentanyl and 3 grams of methamphetamine in Catanese's purse. Deputies also learned that Catanese was wanted on a felony warrant from Arapahoe County.

Deputies arrested O'Neill for unlawful possession of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Catanese was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, unlawful distribution, manufacture, dispensing of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, a protection order violation, and a fugitive of justice warrant.

O'Neill and Catanese have been booked into the Pueblo County Jail.

“This is another example of how our deputies’ proactive patrols help keep our community safe,” said Pueblo County Sheriff David J. Lucero. “By being alert and thorough, these deputies were able to remove some wanted individuals and some dangerous drugs from our streets. Outstanding warrants and illegal drugs pose serious risks, and we will continue to act swiftly when such situations arise.”
